 - For example, the owner can invite the people to this web page by oneself.

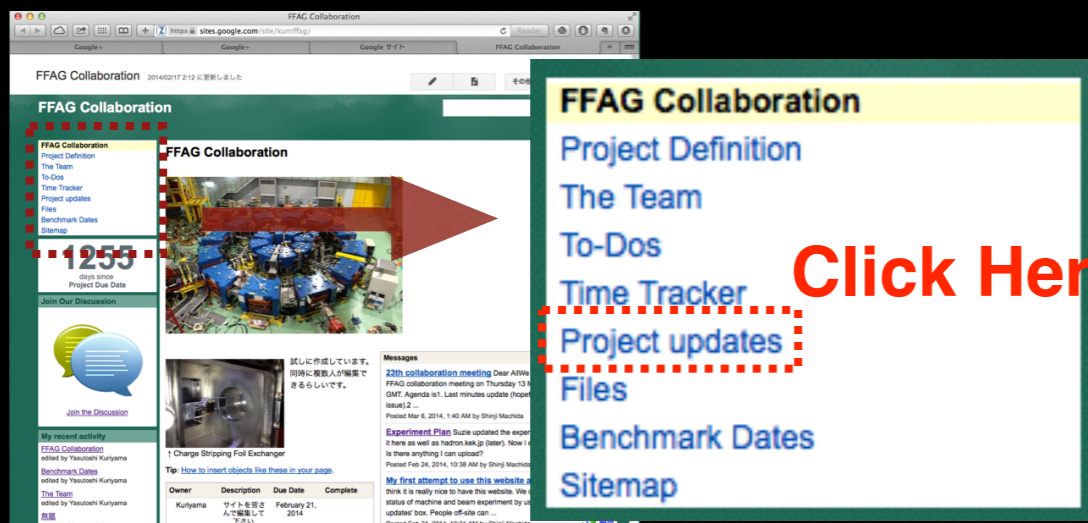
Collaboration Web Page (3)

 - In Machida-san's e-mail...

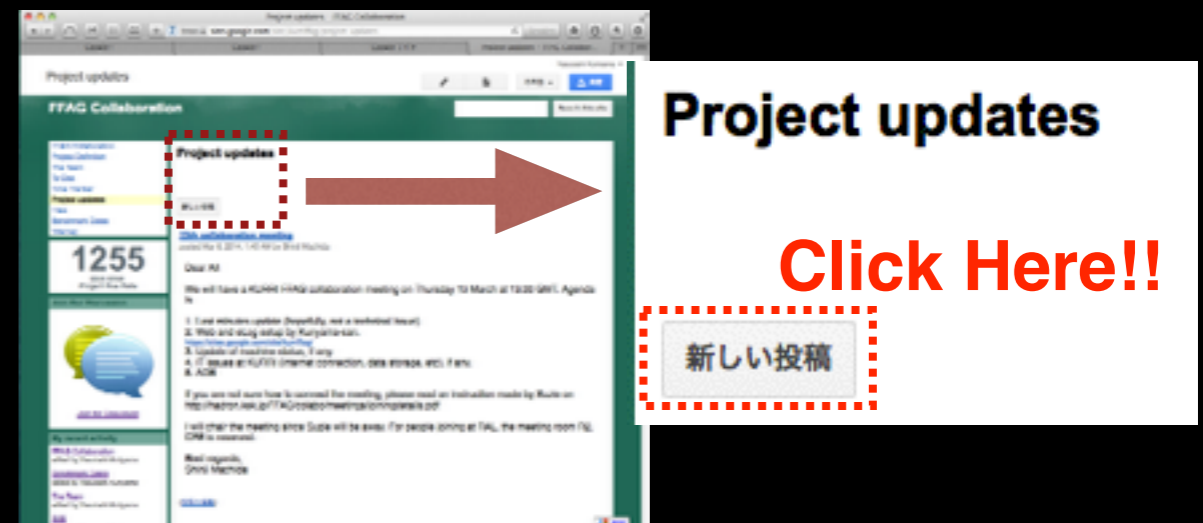
1. Click <https://sites.google.com/site/kurriffag/> You may not be able to login instantly, but perhaps Kuriyama-san gives you the permission within a day.
2. You see the front page once you login. There is a "Messages" box on the right hand side.
3. In order to post "eLog", click "Project updates" in the menu left hand side.
4. You see the messages posted previously. You can add new message called "post" by clicking "New post".
5. In the new window, you can put title and content. This could be done as frequent as possible during the experiment.
6. It is also possible to add files, it says. However, I cannot upload one of my pictures by some reason. (in fact, a picture is posted successfully!)
7. Click "save" on top.
8. I hope now you can see my first attempt.

IT issues at KURRI

Yasutoshi KURIYAMA (KURRI)

- Internet connection
 - In KURRI network, proxy server should be used
 - There are some restrictions.
 - Ex. you cannot use ftp service in this network.
 - I recommend the eduroam service.

What is eduroam?

eduroam (**education roaming**) is the secure, world-wide roaming access service developed for the international research and education community.

eduroam allows students, researchers and staff from participating institutions to obtain Internet connectivity across campus and when visiting other participating institutions by simply opening their laptop.

- If you don't have the account of eduroam, please ask your institute network administration office how to get this.
 - Or you can get temporary eduroam account at KURRI. Please ask the staff of KURRI about this after arrival of KURRI, if you need
- Data storage
 - At least, a few Gigabyte storage may be needed.
 - Removal HDD (SSD?) or USB flash drive?
 - the Cloud service?
 - DropBox, One Drive...
 - Send DVD by AirMail?
